

## **SOLO Taxonomy: The Holocaust**

- 1. What do we mean when we refer to the Holocaust? Define in your own words. How is it different from Genocide?
- 2. Sequence the main events of the Holocaust from 1939 1945
- 3. Classify groups of people who were persecuted by the Nazis.
- 4. Explain in your own words the main reason why the Holocaust occurred.
- Compare and contrast the Holocaust in two nations of your choice, for example, you might like to compare the experiences of the Netherlands with Poland, France with Italy or Spain.
- Describe the impact of the Holocaust on society. This may be interpreted broadly, so for example, this could be the impact upon a family.
- 7. Form an analogy about the concept of "genocide".
- 8. Generalise; Make generalisations about the concept of genocide and concepts to which it is related
- 9. Critically evaluate the proposition that war enables genocide to occur.
- 10. Predict the likelihood of an event like the Holocaust happening again.
- 11. Based on your case studies, design criteria for genocide that would enable it to be identified and prevented in the future.
- 12. What if the Holocaust had not taken place when it did?
